

Bicycle and Motorcycle No Parking Zones and Parking Lots (as of April 1, 2024)

Bicycles, motorcycles, and other similar vehicles left unattended in No Parking Zones, such as streets, sidewalks, and parks, will be removed in accordance with City ordinances.

(Vehicles will be considered unattended if the owner is not within its vicinity and cannot immediately move it.)

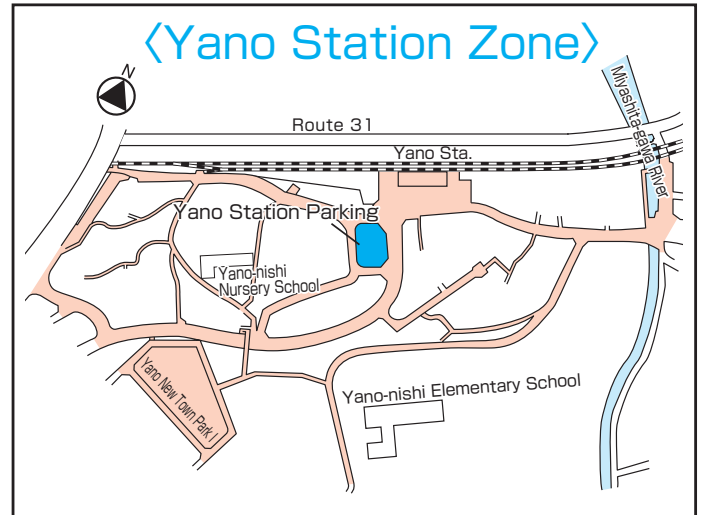
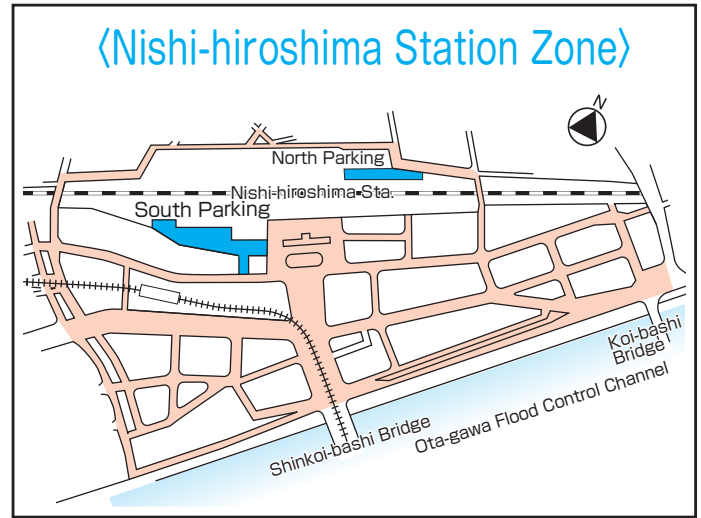
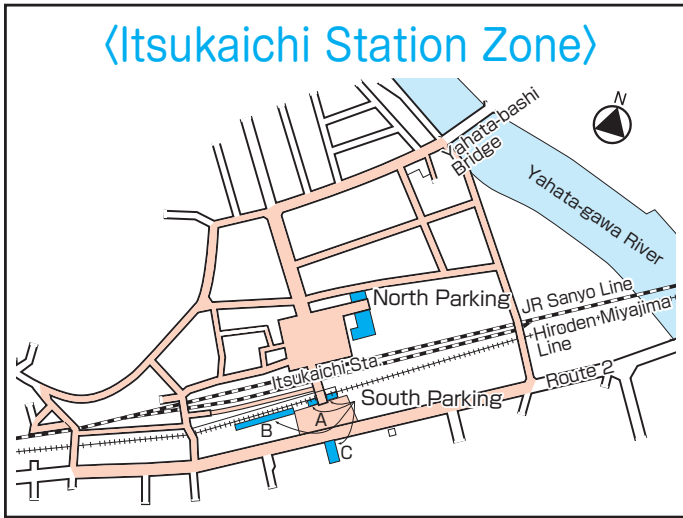
Please note that this applies regardless of how long the vehicle has been parked.)

Designated Parking Lot Fees

One-off parking (per day)

Bicycles: ¥100 Motorcycles: ¥250

Monthly parking (users must register their vehicles)

Bicycles: ¥1,500 Motorcycles: ¥2,500

For Inari-machi, Ote-machi Sanchoe, Komachi I-III, and Fujimi-cho I-III parking lots

Bicycles: ¥1,300 Motorcycles: ¥2,300

You will need:

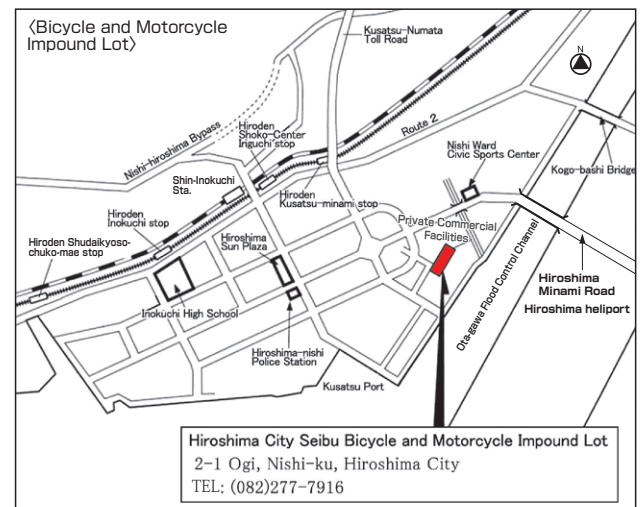
① Vehicle/lock key ② Identification (Driver's license, student ID, etc.)

③ Removal and impound fee: Bicycle ¥2,200 Moped (up to 50cc) ¥4,400 Motorcycle ¥5,500

● Vehicles will be kept for up to one month, after which the City will dispose of them.

● Opening hours: 10:30 am - 7:00 pm

● Closed: National holidays, December 29 - January 3
