Put out household waste by 8:30 am on the collection day.

Large Waste Removal Support (Anshin Support)

If you live alone and are unable to move Large Waste to the collection site by yourself, collection staff will assist you in removing the refuse from your residence.

How to apply: Apply online or by phone to the Large Waste Information Center at least two weeks before the collection date.

Fees: You only need to pay the fee for disposing of Large Waste.

Criteria: Must live alone

Note: There are some exceptions for those who don't live alone. If, of those living with you (including yourself), no one, or just one person does not fall under the following (1)-(5), you may apply for this service.

- (1) Those who are enrolled in Long-Term Care Insurance and certified as requiring long-term care and support
- (2) Those who have been issued the Physical Disability Certificate, Special Needs Certificate or Mental Disability Health and Welfare Certificate
- (3) Those who are expecting a child or who gave birth within the past year and have received a Maternal and Child Health Handbook
- (4) Those who are 65 years of age or older
- (5) Those who are still receiving compulsory education



If you wish to bring Large Waste to a waste collection facility by yourself

Other Information



The smoke, soot, and strong smells caused by burning waste can be disruptive to your neighbors. In most cases it is illegal. The City has received numerous complaints from residents stating that they cannot open their windows due to smoke, that their fences and laundry are getting dirty, and that they are concerned about the adverse effects to their health.



Illegal dumping is a crime: not only does it make communities unpleasant places to live but it also causes serious environmental damage such as the pollution of public bodies of water.
