Press Coverage for the Peace Memorial Ceremony

Coverage for the Peace Memorial Ceremony (herein "the Ceremony") on Saturday, August 6, 2022 must adhere to the following regulations. We thank you for your cooperation.

Inability to adhere to these regulations may result in the rejection of your press coverage application. We appreciate your understanding regarding this matter.

Note that **the content of these regulations is subject to change** in response to management and security needs.

1. Approved Organizations

In principle, permission to cover the Ceremony is granted to the following organizations only:

- (1) Media Organizations
 - a) Japanese Media
 - Member companies of the Japan Newspaper Publishers and Editors Association
 - Member companies of the National Association of Commercial Broadcasters in Japan
 - Member companies of the Hiroshima City Press Club (herein City Press Club)
 - b) Foreign Media
 - 1. Member companies of the Foreign Press in Japan (FPIJ)
 - 2. Holders of Foreign Press Registration Cards issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (who do not fall under 1.)
 - 3. Foreign media organizations that apply via the Foreign Press Center (who do not fall under 1. or 2.)

Note: In addition to submitting a Press Coverage Application, you must also apply to the Foreign Press Center. Please attach a copy of ID issued by the media organization you belong to. If you are freelance, attach a copy of a letter from the media organization you have been contracted by.

- (2) Non-media Organization
 - Public institutions and other equivalent bodies
 - Cable television broadcasters, filming and production companies
- (3) Others
 - Organizations deemed equivalent to the above by the City of Hiroshima's Public Relations Division.

2. Basic Regulations

(1) Limited Access Area (Map 1)

Entry is not permitted to the Limited Access Area (see Map 1) without a Press Pass. From 5 am, entry to the Area (including re-entry) is only permitted from the entrance to the west of the fountain on the south side of the Peace Memorial Museum Main Building.

(2) Press Areas and Press Passes (Map 2)

a) For security reasons and to ensure the Ceremony proceeds with due dignity, the press is restricted to designated Press Areas. Those covering the Ceremony in these areas must wear a Press Pass issued by the City of Hiroshima (see right) and a company armband.



- b) Please make sure to wear the Press Pass around your neck and the armband on your left arm so that they are clearly visible to security personnel.
 - Also, when filming or photographing following the ceremony, we ask that you wear your company armband so that you can be identified as press.
- c) Press Passes are color-coded according to each Press Area. Before submitting your Press Coverage Application, please carefully confirm which area you would like to apply for. One pass per person.

Please see 3. Press Areas for information on the areas, Press Pass colors, restrictions, etc.

- If you applied by email: a printout of the processed application form which we sent back to you after receiving your application (for ID purposes).

When You May Collect Your Pass

From 9 am, July 25 (Mon) until 12 pm, August 5 (Fri)

 If you are unable to collect your Press Pass during this time due to unavoidable circumstances, please come to the press reception desk within the Ceremony venue

- between 6:30 am and 7 am on August 6 (Sat) and we will issue your pass then. **Press Passes will not be issued after 7 am on August 6.**
- As the only entrance to the Ceremony venue from 5 am on August 6 is to the west of the fountain on the south side of the Peace Memorial Museum (see Map 1), we expect crowding. Please arrive with plenty of time to spare.

• Strictly no access from the central walkway to the Cenotaph or participant seating after 7:30 am.

[•] Entering or exiting Press Areas is not permitted during the specified times. (Outside these times, holders of Press Passes of all colors may enter for preparation purposes.)

² As seating is limited, if we receive more applications than there are seats available, we may ask you to change Press Area.

³ Use of stepladders is not permitted. Furthermore, in consideration of Ceremony attendees, please only use the still photography camera stands provided when filming/photographing.

⁴ A member of staff will guide members of the press during these portions of the program. **Please follow their instructions**.

⁵ Please observe the following:

Meet at the meeting point described on Map 3 between 6:40 and 7:30 am (no entry to the museum after 7:30 am).
 If you need access to the museum before 6:40 am to set up equipment, please consult with the City of Hiroshima's Public

Relations Division in advance.

- Bring and wear a helmet. Those not wearing helmets will be refused permission to cover the Ceremony.
- Do not film or photograph anything south of the park from the museum rooftop.
- Note that when applying for a Press Pass for Press Area 7 (Museum Rooftop), applicants are required to also submit a Written Pledge for Press coverage from the Peace Memorial Museum Rooftop (Attachment 2).
- ⁶ Communal camera stands will be set up in the northern part of this area. However, please note that the use of stepladders is not permitted on these stands as they disrupt the sound from the loudspeakers.

⁷Use of stepladders is not permitted.

4. Pre-Ceremony Coverage at the Cenotaph and Other Locations

(See Attachment 1 for details)

- 1. From 6:00 am until the end of the Ceremony, no filming or photography is permitted in the Access Permitted Area (except for in designated Press Areas during the Ceremony). Also, please do not obstruct people paying respects at the Cenotaph.
- 2. Out of consideration for those paying their respects at the Cenotaph, you must not obstruct the view of the front of the Cenotaph at any time when filming.

5. Special Regulations for Coverage

- 1. Out of respect for the participants, we ask that members of the press wear appropriate clothing (for example, white dress shirts and black dress pants). If covering the Ceremony in Press Areas 3-6 (Triangle Area and Cenotaph Surroundings) detailed on Map 2, please be particularly mindful of this request.
- 2. If you have any inquiries regarding Ceremony coverage, please confer with on-site City staff who are wearing the armband pictured right or are at the press reception desk.
- 3. Simultaneous interpretation in English via receiver will be available to journalists sitting in Press Area 1 (see Map 2). We ask that you collect your receiver, if necessary, from the press reception desk. Please return the receiver to the press reception desk promptly following the end of the Ceremony.
- 4. Please refrain from covering the Ceremony by air between 7:40 am and 9:15 am on August 6 as it is disruptive to Ceremony proceedings and out of respect for the citizens of Hiroshima. Additionally, flying drones in Peace Memorial Park is prohibited.

6. Traffic Restrictions on the Day of the Ceremony

(See Attachment 4 for details)

- 1. No traffic is permitted on Peace Boulevard (from the NHK building to west of Nishi-heiwa-ohashi) from 6:30 to 9:30 am on August 6. However, restrictions will be lifted in the area designated by the arrows on Map 5 for press organization vehicles bearing the designated Traffic Pass. Please note that even vehicles bearing the Traffic Pass may be subject to restrictions due to security reasons.
- 2. No access is permitted to Peace Memorial Park for the duration of the Ceremony; access will only be permitted after 10 am.
- 3. A designated Traffic Pass will also be required for vehicular access to Peace Memorial Park from August 1 (Mon) until the end of August 5 (Fri), as well as outside of traffic restriction times on the day of the Ceremony.

Note: Excluding broadcast vans and power supply cars, no parking is permitted within Peace Memorial Park.

7. COVID-19 Infection Prevention Measures

- 1. Only submit Press Coverage Application for the minimum number of people necessary.
- 2. We ask that you thoroughly monitor your own health (take your temperature etc.) on August 6, and refrain from entering the venue if you have concerns regarding your health due to a fever or even mild symptoms (e.g., cough, sore throat), or if you have consulted a medical professional or taken medication for cold-like symptoms within the past two weeks.
- 3. Inside the venue, take COVID-19 measures such as hand-sanitizing and avoiding crowding.
- 4. Wear a mask inside the venue. Out of respect for attendees, all masks must be white.

8. Press Waiting Room

A Press Waiting Room will be set up in Ran 2 (2BF) of the ICCH between 6:30 am and 12 pm on

Saturday, August 6 (see Map 5). Please feel free to use the electrical sockets in the Press Waiting Room and wireless access points for the Internet. You can also use the Wi-Fi in the lobby in front of the Dahlia Room on the same floor.









Limited Access Area and Pre-Ceremony Coverage at the Cenotaph and Other Locations




Press Area 7 (Museum Rooftop) Meeting Point

- You will be led from the meeting point to the Peace Memorial Museum rooftop by a member of staff.


