Course Description and Schedule	<p>The courses Nuclear Weapons and International Security I & II aim to deepen students' understanding of current issues and research trends related to nuclear affairs, including arms control, disarmament, non-proliferation, nuclear strategy, and deterrence.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Nuclear Weapons and International Politics I: Students will read two (relatively) short articles per lesson. The course focuses on analyzing and examining the background, trends, and key debates surrounding contemporary nuclear issues. - Nuclear Weapons and International Politics II: Students will read one academic article per lesson. The course aims to provide a deeper understanding of nuclear issues while also paying attention to the perspectives and methodologies employed by experts in their analyses. <p>For each assigned reading, one designated (or volunteer) student will serve as the presenter, summarizing the article and highlighting key points for the following discussion.
