【4】 Read the following passage “Sugi and Hayfever In Japan” and answer the questions [(1)~(6)].

After a long cold winter, many people look forward to spring's warm sun. Unfortunately, this season also brings an unwanted guest - a heavy production of pollen. According to recent statistics, one in every three people in Japan suffers from hay fever. Historically, Japanese didn't suffer so greatly from this problem. In fact, since the 1980s, the rate of Japanese hay fever sufferers has jumped 300 percent. Have people become weaker in modern times, or is there something else responsible for this large increase?

During world war 2, many naturally occurring trees were cut down for equipment, leaving bare mountains all over the country. After the war, there was a need for a fast growing, insect resistant tree which could grow almost anywhere. Lumber companies found that the best candidate for this was the Japanese cedar tree known as 'sugi'. In time, this tree turned out to be so successful that, according to Japan's Forestry Agency, they now make up around 40 percent of the country's forests.

However, planners did not predict what was to happen 30 years later. The sugi tree is not only a great grower in our mountains, it is also a great producer of pollen. When the tree matures, it dumps large amounts which the wind blows all over the country. According to allergy researchers, this is a major reason for the sudden increase in hay fever sufferers from the 1980s to this present.

To combat this, the Japanese government has decided on measures designed to reduce the clouds of cedar pollen that create the symptoms people with hay fever suffer from every spring. Such measures include cutting down sugi which are nearer to high population areas and replanting them with less impactful varieties. The government will also use subsidies to encourage homebuilders to use large amounts of sugi for housing materials. In order to process all those trees, foreign workers will be brought in as temporary workers to help.

There are also plans to promote research into easing the impact of allergies through immunotherapy and to increase the production of anti-allergy drugs to aid in preventing allergic reactions. Japan will double the output of such medication from 250,000 people per year to 500,000 people per year. Furthermore it will encourage people to begin preventative treatment before pollen season starts, to lessen the severity of hayfever.
