

Policies Regarding the Transformation and Honoring of the Paper Cranes (Final Compilation)[Summary]

(Compiled by the Policy Review Committee for Transforming and Honoring the Paper Cranes/February 2012)

◎ Concept (Underlying principles)

Creating shared thoughts for peace and passing them along as a new vision

We are promoting policies to transform and honor the spirit of the paper cranes, so that the peace wishes dedicated to their creation may reach beyond local boundaries and enter the hearts of many people around the world, expanding the circle of support for nuclear weapons abolition and giving rise to a shared, global vision towards world peace.

◎ Objectives

Measures to transform the paper cranes will be carried out following the below general objectives, in line with comprehensive consideration of the purpose, means, and utility of each activity, allowing for revision and renewal of measures as necessary.

Convey and transmit the message of peace

- In line with Hiroshima's mission after its revival from ruins after the atomic bombing, we hope to resurrect the paper cranes as a tool for peace promotion. Through their creation, the cranes are imbued with peace thoughts of people from all around the world, which we hope to transform and spread as a universal wish for world peace.
- Making full use of their beautiful colors and shapes, we hope to use the cranes' visual impact to express the peace spirit entrusted to them in an effective and easily understandable way, passing along the experience of the atomic bombing to future generations.

Create a circle of hearts transcending borders and social position

- We aim to promote an understanding of the broader meaning of peace at the individual and interpersonal levels. This includes encouraging values such as treasuring people who are close to oneself, exchange activities towards peace, and measures related to ESD (Education for Sustainable Development).
- As a city who knows past suffering, we wish to make the best use of our history and contribute our experience towards the establishment of international cooperation and contribution activities from a modern standpoint.
- In order to help deliver courage and strength to all members of society, we aim to increase opportunities for active social participation for disabled persons such as through providing employment support, as well as offering messages of encouragement to the elderly.

Create new brands and tourist resources specific to Hiroshima

- In order to heighten the expressive power and impact of all our peace activities, we plan to recruit citizen submissions for a logo representing Hiroshima's paper cranes, which will then be utilized as a visual representation of Hiroshima's peace measures that we hope will permeate into society. In addition to this, we plan to promote the participation of enterprises that value corporate social responsibility.
- We are aiming to strengthen Hiroshima's educational tourism appeal, creating hands-on experience programs for children and school excursion groups which allow them to participate in transforming the paper cranes.
- We plan to hold symbolic events of great visual impact in order to highlight the importance and intensity of our wish for peace. These will include exhibitions highlighting the tremendous volume of paper cranes our city has been gifted, and the ceremonial burning of paper cranes accompanied by a prayer for lasting world peace.

◎ Guidelines

In promoting the above measures, after clarifying the extent and general outline of each procedure, it is important to consider practicality. This includes creating an environment where Hiroshima's citizens and many others can contribute, as well as creating a framework that ensures economical sustainability.

Promotion of citizen-led measures

- In order for increasing numbers of citizens to share the thoughts behind the folding of the paper cranes, it is important for paper crane transformation to become rooted as a citizen activity. To this end, we hope to promote citizen proposals for new measures, solicit citizen participation in their planning and enactment, and distribute paper cranes to organizations whose activities are in line with the above concept.
- We plan to expand the circle of activity at the citizen level by collaborating with schools as part of the peace education curriculum, by striving to stimulate local activity and opportunities, such as the “One Community Hall, One Nation” movement during the Asian Games, and by creating a network of currently active organizations.
- As we wish for this movement to progress mainly through the hands of the citizens, we will recruit volunteers to work towards project implementation and management, and call for free contribution of opinions.
- In order to promote regional exchange and increase participation of disabled persons in society, we will be cooperating with employment support centers for persons with disabilities and other associated organizations to include disabled persons in paper crane transformation projects.

Creation of a framework for sustainability

- By selling crane paper and recycled paper crane products, as well as charitable origami paper, we will develop a framework for using the paper cranes themselves as a source of funding for peace-related projects. In addition to this, we will create a fund from donation money attached to the crane contributions.
- By actively undertaking activities that stimulate the economy, such as holding events and selling recycled paper crane products, we aim to raise citizen awareness and create a long-term, sustainable project.

Consideration of the sentiments of the paper cranes’ contributors

- For projects of a delicate nature such as honoring the paper cranes through ceremonial burning, careful attention will be paid to the manner of implementation, so as to act in consideration of the wishes of the atomic bomb survivors and the children who donated the cranes.

◎ Implementation

Based on the results of trial implementations and opinions and ideas submitted by citizens, we present a concrete plan below that exemplifies how projects shall be implemented, as well as their intended effects and points of consideration.
